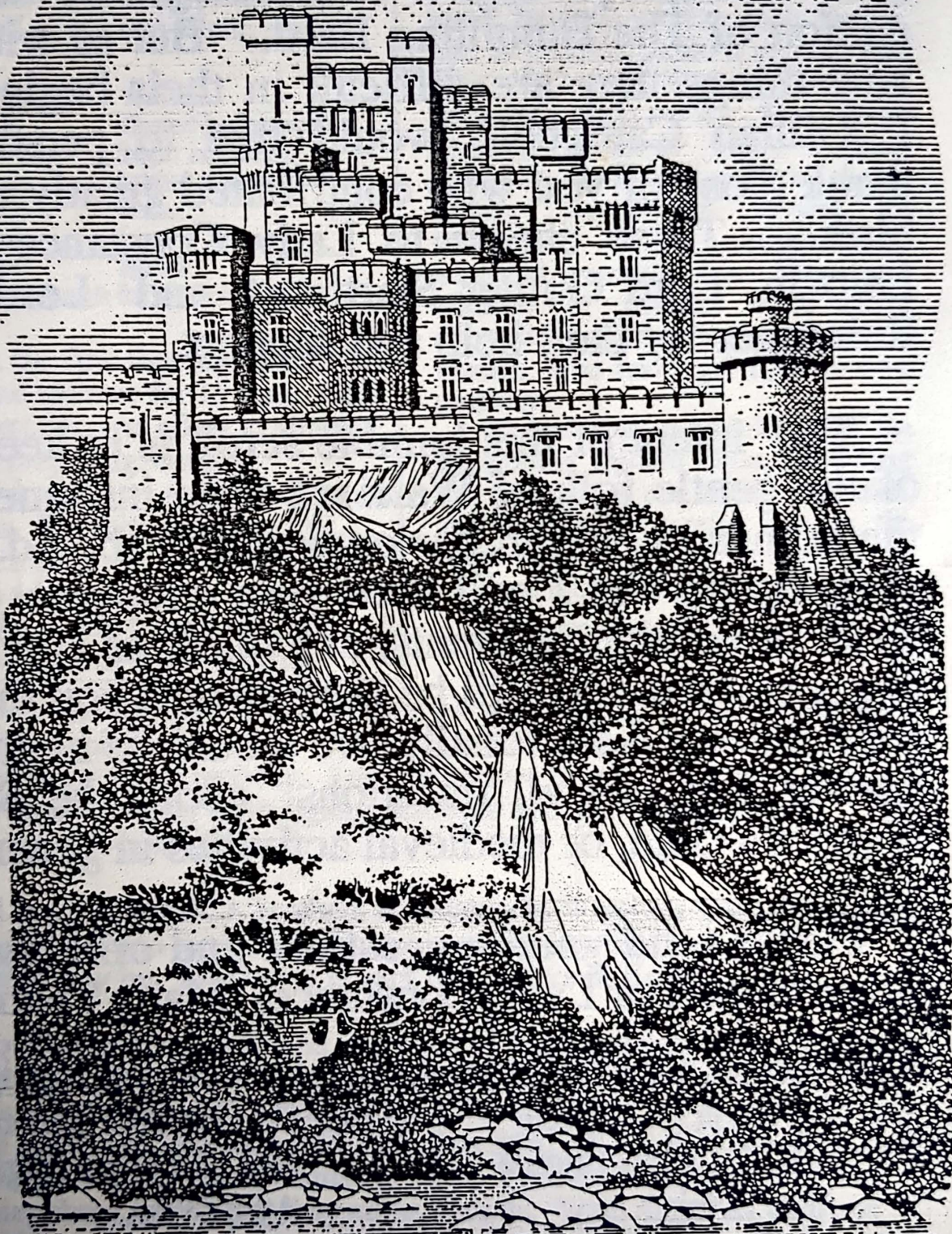

Torturously Tremendous Tarts

This recipe comes to us from the fires of Jay Reinsager. These delightful tarts were particularly enjoyed at our last event. Enjoy.

1 1/2 cups	Raisins
1 tsp	Grated lemon peel
3/4 cup	Sugar or Honey
8 ea	Saltine Crackers
1 cup	Water
2 tbl	Lemon Juice
1 tbl	Butter

pastry dough for two pie crusts

Mix the first five ingredients in a pan and simmer for 15 min. Add the next two and allow to simmer while preparing dough.

Cut dough into 4-6 inch diameter circles. Fill with mixture, fold crust in half, and press along the edges with a fork.

Bake at 350 degrees for appx 15 min or until tarts are brown.

WOMEN AND THE MIDDLE AGES

By the 13th century, women were on all levels of trade, as investors in overseas commerce, as townshop keepers, as entrepreneurs running small businesses from their homes, and as peddlers at town markets and fairs. Although, women engaged in overseas trade were few, large numbers could be found working alongside their husbands in shops. Family partnerships created an influential and economically powerful merchant class. Wives and widows of masters were often allowed in guilds, along with single women, who had legal right to own property.

Women were the backbone of the developing middle class, providing for themselves and their families, and keeping a careful eye on the finances of the family business.

Pavane

(Carolingian Pavane)

Starting Position:

Dancers form a line of couples, facing the head of the hall, with the ladies on their lord's right, and join hands (holding hands at whatever level is comfortable for the lady, (usually around her waist). Each couple should make sure there is enough space between them and the couple in front of them to allow a person to pass between, and maintain this spacing through the dance.

Steps:

A: S₁ S_r D₁
S_r S₁ D_r
S₁ S_r D₁ (Backwards)

B: S₁ S_r D₁ (Ladies only, moving forward in a circle around the

S₁ S_r D₁ (Ladies only, moving forward in a circle around the

Key:

S1 - Single Left: Step forward (or backward, if called for), and slightly to the left, with the left foot; bring the right foot up next to the left; raise gently up onto both toes, then slowly lower back down.

Sr - Single Right: Step forward (or backward, if called for), and slightly to the right, with the right foot; bring the left foot up next to the right; raise gently up onto both toes, then slowly lower back down.

D₁ - Double Left: Step forward (or backward, if called for), and slightly to the left, with the left foot, then step forward (and slightly to the right) with the right foot, then another step with the left foot, then bring the right foot up next to the left; raise up gently onto both toes, then slowly lower back again.

D_r - Double Right: Step forward (or backward, if called for), and slightly to the right, with the right foot, then step forward (and slightly to the left) with the left foot, then another step with the right foot, then bring the left foot up next to the right; raise up gently onto both toes, then slowly lower back again.

Notes:

This is a very slow, stately dance that is often done as the beginning of an evening's dancing. The steps should be done in a smooth, even manner, never sharp or jumpy. Because of the '3 up - 1 back' pattern of the dance, it may be necessary for the couple at the head of the line to lead the line around the hall to avoid running into a wall. Sometimes the dance is done using only the 'A' part.

While this dance is referred to as 'the pavane', pavanes are actually a type of dance, some of which are also commonly done, such as the Earl of Salisbury Pavane, and the Mannschaft Pavane.
